

## **ONLINE SAFEGUARDING POLICY**

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### **Policy Statement (1)**

The school recognises the importance for all members of the AKS community to be able to understand how to use the Internet and associated e-resources in a responsible and safe manner. Although much use of the Internet falls outside of the school's specific remit of responsibility, which is limited to online access during the school day in accordance with the school's *ICT Acceptable Usage* policy, AKS is committed to making every reasonable effort to inform, advise, and guide all members of its community on a regular and sustained basis, such that individuals' online behaviour may be considered and appropriate at all times and in all places.

Online safety is an integral part of the school's CS and PSHE curriculum for all pupils and is taught in an age-appropriate way relevant to pupils' lives. It is essential that children are safeguarded from potentially harmful and inappropriate online material. A whole school approach is taken to online safety and this empowers the school to protect and educate pupils, students, and staff in their use of technology and establishes mechanisms to identify, intervene in, and escalate any concerns where appropriate. This includes identifying and responding to misinformation, disinformation, and conspiracy theories. The school's curriculum also includes explicit sessions for pupils on the use of danger of AI.

The school has the following core objectives:

- 1) To have an identifiable whole school approach to online safeguarding/E-Safety
- 2) To identify key members of staff with responsibility and expertise for leading on online safeguarding/E-Safety matters
- 3) To train all teaching and non-teaching staff at least annually, so that they can recognise and are aware of online safeguarding/E-Safety issues, including potential risks to their own and to their pupils' online safety
- 4) To include online safeguarding/E-Safety explicitly in the school's curriculum
- 5) To provide education, support and updates for parents with regard to online safety

### **Policy Statement (2)**

- 1) This policy applies to all members of the AKS school community, including those in our EYFS setting.
- 2) AKS implements this policy through adherence to the procedures set out in the rest of this document.
- 3) This policy is made available to all interested parties in accordance with our *Provision of Information* policy. It must be read in conjunction with our *ICT Acceptable Usage (Staff & Pupils)*, *Data Protection*, *Safeguarding* and *PSHE* policies.
- 4) The school is fully committed to ensuring that the application of this policy is non-discriminatory in line with the UK Equality Act (2010). Further details are available in the school's *Equal Opportunity* policy document.

- 5) This policy is reviewed at least annually, or as events or legislation changes require, by the Deputy Head, the Whole School Leadership Team and the Local Governing Body. The deadline for the next review is no later than 12 months after the most recent review date indicated above.

### **Roles & Responsibilities**

- 1) Headmaster:
  - a) The Headmaster has a duty of care for ensuring the safety (including e-safety) of members of the school community, though the day to day responsibility for e-safety will be delegated to the Deputy Head (Pastoral), who will also liaise with the Head of the Nursery and Preparatory School.
  - b) The Headmaster is responsible for ensuring that the Deputy Head (Pastoral) and other relevant staff receive suitable training to enable them to carry out their e-safety roles and to train other colleagues, as relevant.
  - c) The Headmaster will ensure that there is a system in place to allow for monitoring and support of those in school who carry out the internal e-safety monitoring role. This is to provide a safety net and also support to those colleagues who take on important monitoring roles.
- 2) Deputy Head (Pastoral):
  - a) Plays a leading role in the Pastoral Committee, which includes e-safety matters.
  - b) Takes day to day responsibility for e-safety issues and has a leading role in establishing and reviewing the school e-safety policies / documents.
  - c) Liaises with the Head of the Nursery and Preparatory School, to ensure that there is a whole school approach and that Preparatory School practice fully supports that in the Senior School.
  - d) Manages the whole school E-Safety Log.
  - e) Ensures that all staff are aware of the procedures that need to be followed in the event of an e-safety incident taking place.
  - f) Provides training and advice for staff.

- g) Liaises with the Local Authority/relevant support body, as appropriate.
  - h) Liaises with school technical staff.
  - i) Receives daily reports of e-safety incidents and creates a log of incidents to inform future e-safety developments. Reviews the school's filtering and monitoring provision.
  - j) Keeps the WSLT and LGB informed on a regular basis with regard to e-safety matters.
  - k) Seeks feedback from pupils and parents through annual surveys as to the perceived effectiveness of the school's procedures.
- 3) Member of LGB responsible for E-Safety:
- a) Discusses E-Safety matters at least termly with the Assistant Head (Pastoral).
  - b) Monitors the whole school E-Safety Log.
  - c) Reports back to the LGB on a regular basis.
- 4) Systems Manager:
- a) Ensures that the school's technical infrastructure is secure and is not open to misuse or malicious attack.
  - b) Ensures that the school meets necessary technical requirements in support of E-Safety.
  - c) Ensures that the school's network can only be accessed by strong password, in accordance with the *Data Protection* policy.
  - d) Manages and monitors filtering procedures for the school network in line with Group policy.
  - e) Monitors the use of the school's systems (including: network, internet, VLE, remote access, email), in liaison with the Director of Digital Strategy as appropriate, and reports any misuse or attempted misuse to the Deputy Head (Pastoral)

### **Whole School E-Safety**

The following are examples of how the school manages the profile of E-Safety in both the Senior and Preparatory departments:

- 1) E-Safety is a standing agenda item at relevant LGB meetings.
- 2) E-Safety is also a standing agenda item on the termly Pastoral Committee meetings in the Senior School.
- 3) The Deputy Head (Pastoral) leads across the whole school with regard to E-Safety information and initiatives, liaising as appropriate with the Head of Nursery and Preparatory School, the Head of PSHE and the Systems Manager.
- 4) Online safety is an integral part of the school's ICT and PSHE curriculum for all pupils and is taught in an age-appropriate way relevant to pupils' lives.

### **E-Safety for Pupils**

Pupils are informed about E-Safety, as a minimum, by:

- 1) Information displayed around school.

- 2) E-Safety is a standing agenda item for School Council meetings.
- 3) Guidance and instruction in the school's *ICT Acceptable Usage* policy, which each pupil signs on an annual basis.
- 4) Explicit curricular content in the school's PSHE programme (please refer to the *PSHE* policy for further detail).
- 5) At least two assemblies per year.
- 6) Tutor time activities in the Senior School, as directed by the Deputy Head (Pastoral) in liaison with respective Heads of Year.

### **E-Safety for Staff**

Teaching and non-teaching staff are informed about E-Safety, as a minimum, by:

- 1) Information displayed in respective staff areas.
- 2) At least one annual update as part of a scheduled staff training day/session.
- 3) Guidance and instruction in the school's *ICT Acceptable Usage* policy, by which all staff are bound and to which all staff agree by signature annually.

### **E-Safety for LGB Members**

Members of the Local Governing Body are informed about E-Safety, as a minimum, by:

- 1) At least one annual update at a full LGB meeting by the Deputy Head (Pastoral).
- 2) Termly updates by the Deputy Head (Pastoral) at the Education & Welfare sub-committee.

### **E-Safety for Parents**

Parents are informed about E-Safety, as a minimum, by:

- 1) Twilight sessions run by external speakers or staff at regular intervals.
- 2) Links and useful external resources sent home to parents at least annually.
- 3) Relevant policies on the school website, to which parents are directed at least annually in a communication from the Headmaster.
