- Undergraduate courses are typically taught in English.
- Students can apply for scholarships directly with each university with some funding available from private programmes and institutions.
- Students must apply directly to their chosen university or college. In many cases, international students can now apply online.
- Most students attending an institution on Education City opt to stay in student housing. The campus has purpose-built modern residential halls with studio, one- and two-bed apartments.
- International students who don't hold a valid State of Qatar residence permit (excluding GCC citizens) must apply for a student visa and can do this online at <u>qatarevisaonline.com</u>.
