Key Information:

- In total there are 26 public higher education institutions, 2 state higher education institutions and 44 private higher education institutions.
- Bachelor's degree programmes last 3 to 4 years. A final state examination finalises the completion of the study program, including the presentation and defence of a thesis.
- The application process is very straight forward. If you are interested in a college/university, you have to contact them individually. The Czech Republic does not have a system that is similar to UCAS.
- If the course is taught in English, the faculty can set individually their prices. For example, English speaking courses in Medicine and Dentistry may charge up to £15,000 per year. However, some courses like in Business can be as low as £2,000.
