Country: Norway

Key Links: A Star Future | Visa Information

Key Information:

- If you come from a country outside the EU/EEA and wish to study in Norway, you must apply for a residence permit for studies. This is also called a study permit.
- The estimated living cost for a student is stipulated to approx £1100 per month or £12,500 per year (2025-26). In addition you may have costs related to insurance, travel, visa fees and tuition fees if applicable.
- Degree seeking students from outside of EU/EEA and Switzerland must normally pay tuition fees when studying in Norway. The tuition fees varies between institutions and study programmes.
- The general basis for admission to Universities and University Colleges in Norway is called the Higher Education Entrance Qualification (GSU).
