Labour Market Fact

Learner participation in Apprenticeships in 2024/25 increased by 3.4% to 761,480 compared to 736,530 the previous year.

Under 19s accounted for 21.2% (74,990) and learners recorded as having a learning difficulty or disability increased by 6.9%, to 56,810 from 53,150. Source

Key Information:

- Belgium's tuition fees are also relatively affordable compared to the neighbouring European study hubs of France and Germany.
- Undergraduate tuition fees for non-EU students typically range from €2,000 to €8,000 (£1,650 to £6,618) per year, with some programmes reaching as high as €15,000 (£12,400).
- Bachelors programmes require three years of full-time study and cover a range of subjects.
- Dutch and French are the primary teaching languages, but English-taught programmes are also available.
- Belgium is home to world-renowned universities and the headquarters of international organisations such as the European Union (EU) and North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO).
