

Key Information:

- Higher education in Ireland is offered by various institutions, including universities, seven Colleges of Education, and 14 Institutes of Technology. Seven of Ireland's universities are state-funded.
- Popular student cities in Ireland include the capital, Dublin, which has
 the highest concentration of universities and colleges. Galway on the
 west coast and Cork on the south coast are also favoured by students.
- Irish universities offer a variety of undergraduate programmes which can be taken on a full- or part-time basis. Full-time courses typically last for three years.
- Entry requirements differ among institutions and courses, so it's important to check with your chosen university before applying.
- To find undergraduate courses, visit <u>CAO Course search</u>.
