Film Director

Directors are integral to the success of any film project, playing a central role in shaping the creative vision and narrative and bringing together all artistic elements to form a cohesive final product. During production, a typical day is between 10 and 12 hours. However, as a director you will usually spend extra time in meetings discussing aspects of the production.

Labour Market Fact

"According to a 2019 report by the UK's Department for Education, only about 4% of teachers in state-funded schools identified as Black, Asian, or from other minority ethnic (BAME) backgrounds. The figure for Black male teachers represents a much smaller fraction of this already small percentage."

Country: Denmark

Key Links: A Star Future | Visa Information

Key Information:

- There are eight universities, 10 university colleges and 9 Academies of Professional Higher Education in Denmark.
- Completion of secondary education at advanced level, equivalent to passing the exam at the end of Danish upper secondary school, is the basic requirement for entry to Danish universities and university colleges.
- Fees for international students vary for every degree programme but will typically be between €8,500 and €15,000 a year.
- Denmark is an expensive country but even here you will find some locations cheaper than others. While Copenhagen will not be cheap by anyone's standards, smaller cities in Denmark are certainly no more expensive than their equivalents in the United Kingdom.
